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Could you give a brief, personal introduction and to your practice? My name is **Chris Hardie** and I am an Architect and Principal at the Danish studio **Schmidt Hammer Lassen**, and Design Director at global firm **Perkins and Will.**

I oversee the work of the combined practice in Asia, and a combined studio of 100 architects and designers in Shanghai.

Could you describe three top skills you look for from your graduate candidates?

In technical skills, we seek solid presentation skills, the ability to draw in **Revit**, and solid 3d skills in **Rhino**

What personal attitudes / characteristics do you seek from your graduate candidates?

Regarding personal skills and characteristics, we seek candidates with **confidence**, energy and a clear ability to explain and talk about their work.

What are your pet hates when receiving portfolios and during interviews? We don't like over complicated portfolios with pages wallpapered with graphics; we prefer calmer more succinct presentations that have impact and clarity.

Don't be late for interviews, and don't lie about your experience.

When reviewing a portfolio, is there anything you specifically look for? How would you suggest candidate's format these?

We look for an understanding of **story telling and graphic control**. Only put something on the page if it contributes to the story you wish to tell about the project.

Don't be afraid of blank space.

When reviewing a CV, what advice would you offer a candidate in making these effective?

4.What would you goals be during the first year in our studio?
5.What other aspects of being an architect are you interested in other than design?

If you could offer one single piece of advice to graduate candidates, what would it be?
