## 4. What is the purpose of the study?

This study aims to explore and examine differences in ego-identity in real and cyberspace on students' learning achievement motivation to provide implications on instructional strategies for blended learning.

#### 5. Why have I been chosen to take part?

To answer these questions, this study will conduct an online survey on 400 Chinese university students above 18 years old.

## 6. Do I have to take part?

Your participation is voluntary, and you are free to withdraw at any time without explanation and without incurring a disadvantage.

## 7. What will happen if I take part?

Upon the ethical approval by the university, the researchers will invite students to participate in the online survey with research information sheet to inform research purposes, research outcome utilizations, and data management. Participants' consent will be gained as part of proceeding with an online survey. The survey questionnaires are developed based on literature reviews and conducted anonymously and completed at the convenience of the participating respondent. The survey is expected to take 20 minutes, maximum. Although the survey does not require participants' personal information such as name and contact number, the survey will ask participants information about gender, year of study, major, students no, level of level of digital competency and internet use time. Thus, the researchers will remove all personal identities, instead, data will be secured in codes and pseudonyms.

### 8. Expenses and / or payments

There is no expense or payment for participating in this project.

#### 9. Are there any risks in taking part?

There is a minimal disadvantage associated with participants' involvement in this study. The main, low-level risk to participants is an inconvenience. In order to avoid such inconvenience, the interview will be arranged according to the participants' schedules. The online survey will be self-paced according to the participants' schedules.

## 10. Are there any benefits in taking part?

Participants will benefit from the future research results through a better understanding of the differences between ego-identity in real and cyberspace on learning achievement motivation, which will broaden the participants' vision in future learning and teaching practice.
